NOAA Rainfall and Stream Level Monitoring System

Randy Gawtry, KØCBH, of Timewave will make a presentation about the NOAA rainfall and stream level monitoring system. This system uses VHF radio, microwave, satellite and Internet resources to create a rainfall and stream level reporting system tied into local, state and national emergency and forecasting centers.

Randy Gawtry is the president of Timewave Technology, Inc. Timewave manufactures instrumentation and communication devices for the amateur radio, industrial and government markets. Randy has been a ham since 1960.

The University of St. Thomas (UST) is located at the intersection of Cretin & Summit Avenues, about 1 mile south of the Cretin Exit on I-94 in St. Paul. 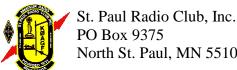
