Low Power DXing on the Low Bands Lou Sica, ACØX

Lou Sica, ACØX, talks about his QST article on getting DXCC on the 80 and 40 meter bands with low power and compromise antennas, plus adds some additional hints, observations and experiences. Come see how to get 100 countries on those last two bands for your 5BDXCC plaque without having to live on a small farm or even having to rewire your radio room for a linear.

Lou has been DXing since the mid 80s, and since then has worked every DXCC entity but two, and has DXCC on the 80, 40, 30, 20, 17,15, 12, and 10 meter bands. All done completely without an amplifier, and often with just single element compromise wire antennas.


Field Day is June 22-23. Ed Jacobson is the chair. We need to work on getting volunteers to help him.
