Coming up March 14th we have two events--the Eau Claire Auction and the resurgence of the Magic Repeater Breakfast. Midwinter Madness is March 28th--we will have a booth and it will need members to tend it. I will attach the flyers accordingly.

I hear the St. Cloud Hamfest was ok, but a smaller turnout of both sellers and buyers. I wasn't there though.

The OWS building is located on the University of St. Thomas (UST) South Campus.

From I-94, take Cretin Ave south about a mile to Grand Ave. Turn right, then park in the ramp on your left or the surface lot on the right. In general, on-campus parking restrictions are not enforced after 6:00 p.m. on Fridays, but do not park in spots with parking meters unless paying or displaying a handicapped placard.

SK Howard Mark, K3HM formerly WØOZC

Past ARRL Dakota Division Director Howard Mark of Burnsville died on January 24. He was 81. An ARRL member, Mark was licensed in 1957. He was appointed as ARRL Dakota Vice Director in 1982 and Director from 1986 until 1993 when he moved out of the Division to Las Vegas, Nevada.

"Howard had been failing the last week or two, and his passing still comes with great sorrow to everyone," said Mike Sigelman (KØBUD), a good friend. "Howard Mark was a highly intelligent person who set a fine example of a great husband and family man and one very devoted to his friends and to our hobby! I know he will be missed by all of us."

During his 17 years in Las Vegas, Mark was an active member of the Las Vegas Radio Amateur Club (LVRAC) and held various club leadership roles.

Survivors include his wife, Margi. The family will hold a private memorial observance.

As a comparison, on Tuesday nights at 2030, the 2 Meter Mining Net will have over 10 attendees and can run for over an hour, all year long. The two nets are run similarly; have cross over net controls and go through the checkins lists twice.

The Friendly Net on 10 meters, run by Marty (KAØNAN) starts pre-check-ins at 1945, regulars join in at 2000 and he says they are usually done by 2030. By the way, Marty would love to have more Net Controls for this net, too. We preferred to keep the nets on the same night so we didn't tie the members up on multiple nights. That might get more net controls too. So, the discussion questions are:

If you are a usual or occasional attendee, what do you think about moving the 2 Meter net to 2030?

If you are NOT a user at 1900, would you be likely to be one at 2030?

George called the SPRC general meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. and asked for Introductions. We had 28 members and 2 guests, plus our presenter (Total of 31).

Secretary's Report: There was one clarification to the General meeting minutes posted in the Ground Wave. Henry (KC9IMC) is working with Tom Sturm and others on the UST station with the intent of making it remotely accessible.

Treasurer's Report: Allan has renewed our club's liability insurance policy, and our corporate registration as a non-profit with the State of Minnesota. He has also sent our supporting check to Al (KØAD) for the 2015 Minnesota QSO Party (as we have done in the past). Fund balances: Education, \$922; Repeater, \$1197 (after expenses); and General, \$6431 (includes auction income).

Committee Reports:

Membership – Dale reports our current paid membership is 126.

Education - Allan reported that the board is considering not having a Spring 2015 class.

Circuit Builders - Orcy will have Circuit Builders tomorrow at 9:00AM.

Public Service/Emergency Communications - Ralph said that Richfield is looking for a Ham/CERT person to join their team.

VE Exams - Leon says that a testing session is scheduled for tomorrow, with details on the web page.

Old Business:

Auction results – Gross income \$1375, Expenses for food \$47 and rent \$225, Net income \$1103.

New Business:

Board Meeting February 13, 2015

A meeting of the St. Paul Radio Club Board of Directors was called to order on November 14, 2014, at 7:30 PM by President George Power.

1. License class

We decided not to offer the General license class this Spring. We are having problems (as are other clubs) with recruiting students who can take eight weeks of evening classes. Allan, our class coordinator has asked to be replaced.

An alternative discussed was to put links on our web page to YouTube videos (example: David Casler KEØOG has complete Technicians, General and Extra courses on-line, as do several other hams) and offering our club's "Elmers" if they have questions about the course materials. If students want hands-on learning environments, there are weekend courses for Techs (such as one in Roberts, WI on March 20-22, 2015).

If we go this route, we need to contact our list of Elmers to see if they are still available.

2. Upcoming Programs

Our March and May programs are set (3/6 is Greg Widin—presentation on "Why I am an ARRL Member," and 5/1 is Lyle Koehler—program on Cheap and Easy SDR (including using one as a panadapter with the cheap USB dongles).

Our plan is to offer club members a chance to tell their favorite radio story. We'll give members 5 minutes to talk about anything they want that is radio related, such as their first or favorite Elmer, or how they got interested in ham radio, or when did they get their first QSO, etc. The "sky is the limit". We will need to recruit some speakers to get the talks going.

3. Banquet

The date has not been set yet, but we are favoring Saturday, April 11 or 18. Orcy will check with Ralph Fodor for availability, and then Jay will reserve the facility.

4. MN Repeater Council

We are looking for a club representative to attend the April 11, 2015 meeting of the Council, in Mankato. None of the board members can attend on that date. We'll recruit in the March Ground Wave, and we could also ask Terry (NGOIC) if he would like to represent us (besides his own repeater network).

5. Advertising for meetings

George will continue to use the radio reflectors to advertise our meetings.

6. Board meeting by video

We've discussed holding the board meetings by video conferencing rather than in person. George will work with Allan to test Google Hangouts.

7. Special Projects

Our last two special projects were the Foxhunt and the Special Event operating from the Transportation Museum, both of which were in 2011. We will put a note in the Ground Wave soliciting ideas. "Are there any activities that you've heard about in other clubs, that you would like to have the SPRC try?"

8. Remote radio station

Our position on the UST remote radio station is that "SPRC's involvement now is to encourage UST's progress with setting up the remote operation of their rigs. . . Primarily by providing financial support and some physical labor and assistance, as UST lets us know how we can help."

Allan brought up the schedule, which will aim at getting a station operational over this summer.

9. Dale's goodies

We are considering changing the time or day/night of the SPRC 2-meter net. The present Wednesday night net at 7:00 PM draws a core of 4-6 people, but seldom has more attendees. It seems like a lot of work on the part of the Net Control Operators for a very limited response. Options tossed around include moving it to follow Marty's "Friendly Net" at 8:00, or to try another night. This change is still in the early stages of consideration.

We will send a check for \$1,000.00 to the ARRL for the Spectrum Defense Fund. We are looking for alternate database options for the auction, as Dallas is retiring from his years of auction database manager. Both free and commercial options are being considered.

As a recruiting incentive for a Secretary volunteer, we will purchase a digital recorder to help the volunteer with taking notes of the minutes of both the General and the Board meetings.

The meeting ended around 8:10PM.
