Unique Antenna Tuner

John Hines, NØKCJ

John will tell us about the antenna tuner he has developed to use with his "small transmitting loop." Seeking an inexpensive and effective solution, he has been experimenting with a tunable water-dielectric capacitor, resulting in the excitement of high voltage, high current, mechanical failures and sparking. All the stuff hams live for. He'll be demonstrating the loop and antenna tuner on the lawn outside Owens Science Hall around 6:45 p.m..

John explains that, having spent most of his life and career in mechanical/electronic endeavors, it was almost inevitable that he would acquire an amateur radio license. KBØDOR came into being, but not for long as he upgraded to Technician, General, and Advanced class. As a Tech, he was granted the call sign NØKCJ and has kept it through all the upgrades because he just liked it!
