His first license was attained in 1977 and he's currently an Extra Class licensee. He's had experience with various versions of dipoles and several verticals as well as grounding systems and problem mitigation.

Employment included working at Univac and Control Data from 1961 until 1975. In 1976 he purchased his first commercial computer for business use. His career has included participation or leadership in several large software applications.
