Finally it has arrived, the election of Officers. The change of command, new leadership coming, opportunity for new members to step up into the administration of Club activities. Section 5. All officers and directors shall take office immediately upon announcement of the vote results.

Section 6. Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office, or in the Board of Directors, such vacancy shall be filled by special ballot at the first next regular meeting. The term to be filled shall be the term of the vacant position."

What this says is very plain. John Faughn, our VP will become a candidate for President and has accepted such. Secretary Don is willing to stay on, with George taking notes when Don is away. Treasurer Allan has offered to stay, too, and has done a remarkable job over the years in any position he's had. George is running hard for the coveted Past President
