Banquet Directions

From the Cretin-Vandalia exit on I-94, take Cretin Avenue south to the St. Thomas campus. The Anderson Student Center is on the northeast corner of Summit Avenue and Cretin. There is a drop – off circle near the west entrance to the student center (off Cretin, just north of Summit).

Once inside the student center, take the elevators at the west end of the atrium to the third floor. The Rogge-Leyden room is to your left as you exit the elevator.

Parking for a limited number of vehicles is available in the Anderson Student Center Ramp (entrance on the west side of the building, off Cretin just north of Summit). Swipe a credit card at the entrance and the doors will open. You will repeat the process to exit (cost is 1.00/hr). If the student center ramp is full, the larger Anderson Parking Ramp is located one block south at the southwest corner of Cretin and Grand Ave.

Other parking possibilities include onstreet parking and various campus surface lots. Parking permits on campus are not enforced after 6 p.m. on Fridays (or on weekends) meters and restricted parking are enforced.

SPRC MINI-HAMFEST

We'll continue to offer a "mini-hamfest" to the amateur community during our social meeting time from 7:00 to 7:30 PM. This will not be the place to bring in tons of boat anchors or thousands of parts and magazines, but if you have one or two things you would like to sell, this may be the place for you.

The rules are simple:

There is no fee for selling or buying – this is a service to the amateur community. Each seller will be allowed a maximum of two linear feet of table space.

There will be absolutely no selling during the program or business meeting.

If your item does not sell, you are welcome to donate it as a door prize.

If your item does not sell and no one wants it as a door prize, you are obligated to take it home with you (it is now illegal in Minnesota to put electronic equipment in the trash – it must be recycled properly – which often means you must pay someone to do it).

Banquet Program Cathy Wurzer

Cathy Wurzer is currently the host of Morning Edition on Minnesota Public Radio. She is also the co-host of Almanac, a weekly public affairs program produced by Twin Cities Public Television for Minnesota's statewide public television network. Wurzer has won four Emmy Awards for her work on Almanac. Prior to her return to radio, she was an anchor and reporter for WCCO-TV, the CBS affiliate in Minneapolis. She has also been a talk show host for WCCO-AM radio, a producer for KMSP-TV, and political reporter for KSTP-AM radio. She holds degrees in broadcast journalism and urban studies from the University of Wisconsin-River Falls. Wurzer was a trustee for the UW-River Falls Foundation and a member and past president of the Society for Professional Journalists, Minnesota chapter. She is the author of "Tales of the Road: Highway 61." In her spare time, Cathy rides, trains and shows horses, fly fishes for trout, and loves clay sculpture and creating mosaics.


We still need to clarify who has/needs signatory privileges on our bank account.
