I do not want to pull off the road, scan for a PL tone, set it, and then find my way back into traffic. Yes, I know about preloading all the repeaters with tones ahead of the trip, but that requires a level of organization that I lack. So, back to my plea to all repeater operators – please add the PL info to your station ID.

THINGS FUTURE

At our November meeting, we will have a program on Digital Voice on HF (presented by three members of the Stillwater Radio Club) Joe Heitzinger. Keith Miller and Bob Jensen.

EDL (Capital Hill school) program request: Allan talked with Dan, at Capital Hill, and asked what they were looking for (and would settle for) in a program. They are looking for after-school activities for their students. They are not looking for a licensing class. The kids have a relatively short attention span (15-20 minutes) and want more hands-on work rather than bookwork. They do not have much of a budget per student to work with, so buying electronics kits might not fly. We agreed to turn down this request as it seem too much of a burden to corral enough volunteers to run this program.

Equipment: The equipment discussion lead to a request (which Jay accepted) to contact Denise, at Washington Magnet School, to retrieve the club's equipment stored at the school. Yaesu FT-450D and 2m rigs, and some ancillary equipment.

Recruiting for licensing classes: Talk about finding students (even SARA had to cancel their General class for lack of students this fall) started with advertising (signs in community recreation centers, Radio City, listing on the radio reflectors, etc.). There are the usual problems with offering our classes at night during the work week (Thursday), which may never be solved. It evolved into a discussion of on-line study (youtube videos) combined with "Elmers" to answer class questions. No decisions were made.

On-Line meetings: As an aside, we will explore using Google Hangout as a way of holding board meetings without having to drive to UST.

Insurance on club equipment: We have enough equipment that ARRL insurance (with low premiums of \$1.40/\$100.00 replacement value) is worth purchasing. Allan will collect serial numbers on club equipment and purchase the ARRL policy. If you have club equipment, send Allan a list of it (and serial numbers, if applicable).

UST Antennas: George will ask Tom Sturm about whether we can install lightning protection and properly ground the club's antenna leads where they enter the building -- will UST object?

Equipment Disposal Requests :

When we receive requests to help evaluate/dispose of radio equipment (from an estate, etc.), we will not get into selling the equipment for them. If they want to assess and sell, we'll refer to Gary Follett. If they want to donate to the club for our auction (the club gets the proceeds), we can accept it and give them a receipt for the donation.

Radio Station with Remote Operations: Pat Tice's presentation has sparked some interest in remote operations. Tom Sturm thinks it might be a good recruiting tool for students, and asked for a list of what we would need to make it operational. UST has a radio to use, but where to put it? Computer, software, Internet access (with inbound ports through UST firewall), secure location with student access.

Auction issues: We have the space reserved (Jan 29 evening, Jan 30 day). Only issue is getting some assistance for Dallas and the data input process to speed up checkouts

Raffle prizes: John has been looking for one higher-end prize for each monthly raffle, to entice participation. He got a batch of stuff from Gary Follett (who would like a donation receipt letter for the pile). Allan will send Gary the letter.

Repeater: We need a battery for backup on the repeater. Approved \$129 for the purchase of one battery.
