The SPRC annual auction will be held in Room 304 (3rd Floor Lounge) of the Murray-Herrick Campus Center at the University of St. Thomas, Cretin & Summit Avenues, in St. Paul.

Rules are the same as in recent years, with the addition that a seller may set a “reserve” price below which he will not sell the item. This allows for lower minimum bids to get bidding started, but protects the seller from accepting a ridiculously low price.

The club charges sellers a 10% commission, up to a maximum of \$10. Sellers may also donate items to the club to be sold. The net proceeds of the auction will be donated to the ARRL Spectrum Defense Fund.

BOOK REVIEW: Tom Standage *The Victorian Internet: The Remarkable Story of the Telegraph and the Nineteenth Century's On-line Pioneers*. By John Hunt, KGØJD

I recommend this book to any ham with an interest in the days before wireless, especially to hams who still enjoy communicating by Morse Code or other digital modes on the air.

Standage has traced for the reader the history of long-distance communication, from the visual signal telegraphs of the late 1700s in Europe, to the discovery by Alexander Graham Bell and colleagues of voice transmission over electrified wires in the United States in the late 1800s.

Telegraphy as we know of it today - the keys, the telegraph lines and poles, the Morse Code, Western Union -- was developed before wireless, and in fact before wire! Standage has woven the technical history of its development into a series of chapters that illustrate the social, economic and political impact of even minute advances in the speed of message transmission from Point A to Point B. Using a variety of historical sources, he draws parallels between the telegraphy of yore and the internet of today. Once the Morse Code became recognized internationally as a common language for messages sent practically instantaneously over wires, the potential for information overload became very apparent to those living at the time. Sound familiar, emailers, tweeters, and FaceBook users?

The author ends his tale of the Victorian Internet with the laboratory discovery that led to the development of the telephone. There is no mention at all of wireless or radio communication. That's what makes it fascinating. I can't help end this brief review by noting one curious omission of Standage's involving a type of telegraph key that was important to many “boomers”, the operators who pounded the brass at telegraph offices throughout the country, but I'll let you figure out what this might be. Finally, if you need an anagram to inspire you to send some CW on the air, try “Here Come Dots”.

A complete set of rules will be available at the Auction.


The net amount collected by the St. Paul Radio Club will be donated to the **ARRL Spectrum Defense Fund!**

Directions to Meeting: Take the Cretin-Vandalia exit from I94 and take Cretin Avenue six blocks south to the St. Thomas campus. Murray-Herrick Campus Center (MHCC), site of the meeting, is off of Cleveland Ave. South, which is two blocks east of Cretin. Enter the parking lot from Cleveland Ave. South, between Ashland and Portland Avenues. Going south on Cleveland, the entrance to the parking lot is at the bottom of a hill. Not much of a hill, but it's helpful to know about it. Then turn right (west) into the parking lot. On the left (south) side of the parking lot is a loading dock. Take the sidewalk alongside the building, to the right of the loading dock, into the building and go to the elevator on the left. Take the elevator to **Room 304**.

Room 304 is toward the southeast corner of the building, in the old part of the building. It is necessary to take the elevator (or stairs) in the old part of the building because the old 3rd floor does not hook up with the new 3rd floor.

Parking permits on campus are not enforced after 6 p.m. on Fridays.
