Isolation of a different kind by Scott NOAR

Boy haven't we all hear that word enough in the last couple of years. This quick read is on hooking your computer up to that USB port on your radio and thing you should be thinking about. Most all our modern radios have the ability to be computer controlled. This along with the rig control software or the addition of other programs really unlocks the rigs potential. Even though it seems simple enough to plug the radio into the USB port of the computer there are things that should be investigated before doing so. I hope we all have bonded our radio gear together and tied this to a common ground as required. Turning our attention to the rig/computer hook-up you should check if this is a plug and play or if you might want to add a USB Isolation device between the radio and the computer. The issue is that some radios internal USB chips are very sensitive and tend to fail. This usually ends up with a return to the workbench and a big bill for the repair. USB isolation devices are really inexpensive insurance for what they prevent. You can find them on the on-line stores. Most radios have newsgroups of users for your particular radio. This is a great spot to find out if you should be concerned about this or other issues to your radio. There might also be specific recommendations from other users as to what they found works best. In my case I found that adding an isolation device caused no changes to the radio or settings whatsoever.

HELP WANTED

This year will be my 13th year as the VE Liaison for the St. Paul Radio Club. Now that I've been retired for a few years, there are times when I would like to be out of town on the first Saturday of the month (our exam days). So I have decided that this will be my last year in this position. Therefore, your club is looking for a replacement.

Currently, our exam year runs September through June with a session on the first Saturday of each month, plus an additional session in conjunction with the MAGIC Repeater Tailgater. All sessions are being held at Galilee Lutheran Church in Roseville at 9:30 am.

No experience is necessary, as you will be provided with on-the-job training, for a whole year if you act now. I got this position with no previous experience, but merely a

willingness to help out the club. The person for this position needs to be 18 years of age or older; and never have had your amateur station or operator licenses suspended or revoked; and hold a valid Amateur Extra class license; and be an accredited ARRL Volunteer Examiner. To become a VE, you merely have to take an open book exam from the ARRL, and you don't even need to purchase a manual, as it's all online. You don't even need to be a member of the ARRL.

We currently have a large team of experienced VEs who help out with the monthly exams (see the article about last years exams elsewhere in the Ground Wave) so anyone volunteering for this position will have plenty of help. The time commitment for this position is about 2 hours per month plus the exam sessions themselves, which are typically another 2 hours. All paperwork / forms and instruction on their use will also be provided. This is a great opportunity for someone to help out the club with this important position. Please consider doing this. I'm still in the process of moving to the new digs. Progress has been slow but steady. I took the summer off from Radio with the exception of occasionally practicing my morse code sending and receiving. I did attempt to make a contact while on vacation...
