I have to come up with a good color scheme for both it and the E-Bug. Since I have no taste in color combinations (My friends say all my taste is in my mouth, HI HI.) this part is quite stressful for me.

Speaking of that, with the laser back up and running, I ended up cutting 6 additional "kits" of the Bird of Time glider. 5 have been spoken for\picked up. If they all get built by summer, we should have a great couple of contests. Adding in the others that already have a 2 meter glider, there is a distinct possibility that there may be up to 12 planes being flown at these contests this coming summer. The contest has a group start so there may be up to 8 planes launched into the air at the same time, and then 8 planes flying and then landing. All at the same time! This could be quite interesting to say the least. In any case, it will be great fun!

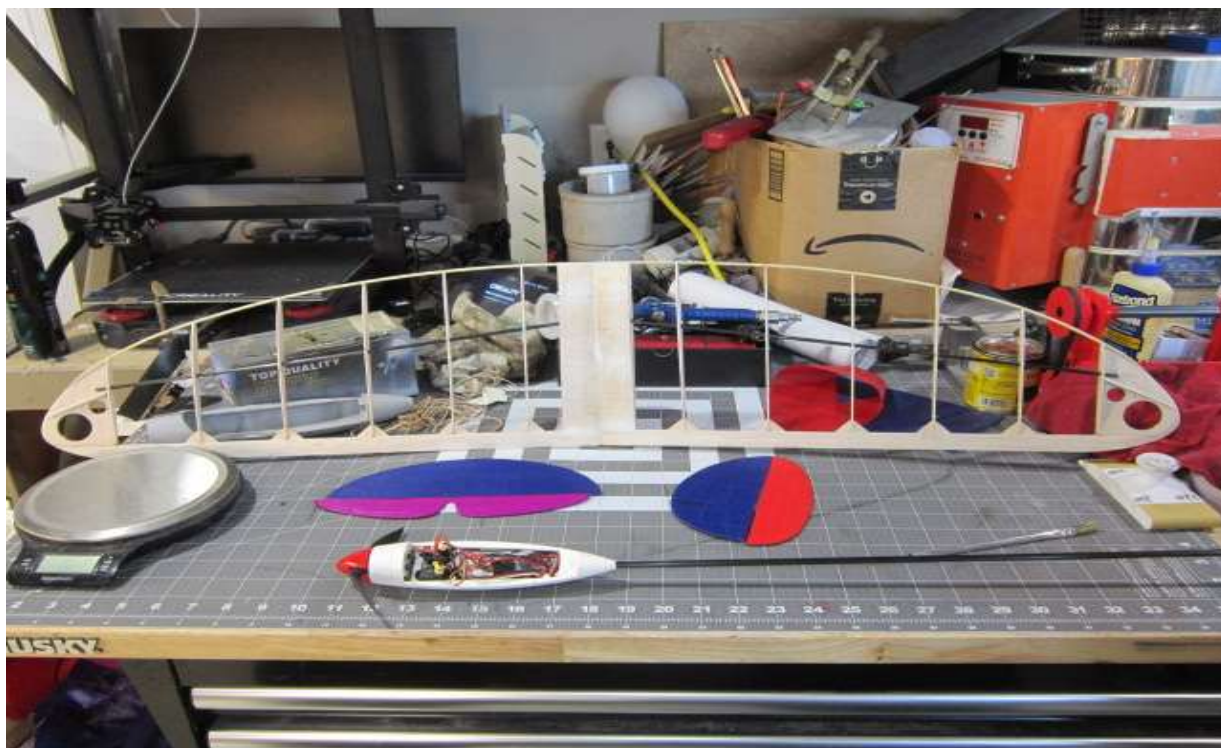

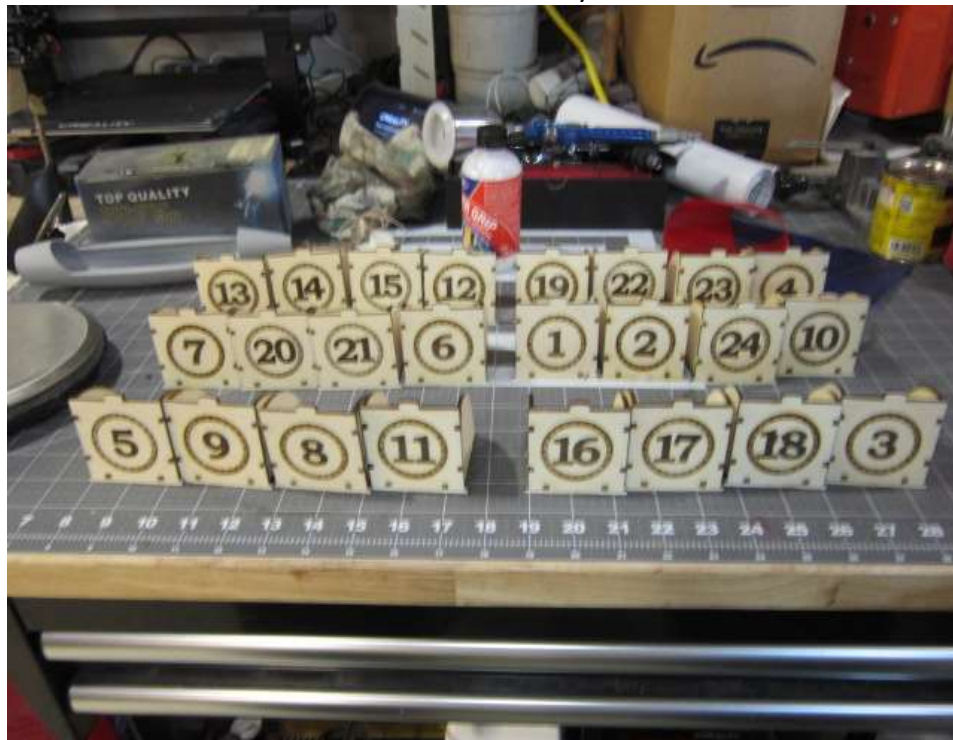
